Route by sea to Australia from Saigon The covers, (Figures 297 and 298), provide no indication of the rouse taken by ship from Saizon to Australia. One nessible rouse

was via Celembo to link with the English mail boot service to Perth. A letter from Salese to Australia in March 1933 was endersed "to be carried on the Burns Philp vessel Neptanie" which sailed

through the islands north of Australia and called at Darwin. Another letter from Paris cancelled 25 May 1932 is backstamoed Perth, Western Australia. It is possible this item was carried to Colombo, Cesten where it inited the P&O/Orient mail steamer

service to Perth.

The first flight between England and Australia in 1919 demonstrated that it was possible to fly such distances.

Reginald Lloyd's proposed an air service between England and Australia** Lloyd, whose father had been a member of the Upper House in the New South Wales Parliament, was confident that he could establish an air service between England and Australia which could cover the

distance in 150 hours fiving time, i.e., arriving within one week of departure. His aim was to fly the distance in 6% days. Lloyd believed that it was not the design of aircraft which was preventing such a flight but the establishment of a suitable mure with the necessary landing fields and facilities. He further believed that no aircraft could fly the full distance. It would be necessary, therefore, to

use relays of aircraft. Any route established must be the shortest possible, subject to reneranhical and elimatic conditions and with road access for

transport of passengers, fuel and spare parts.
